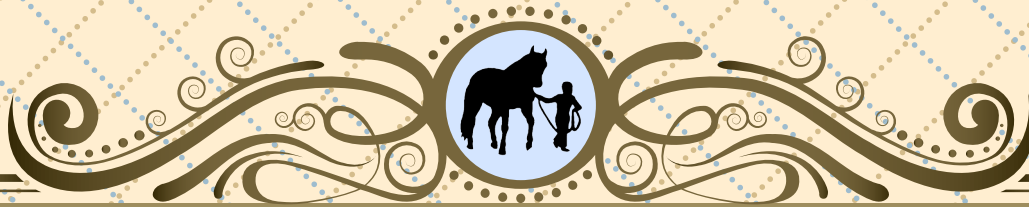


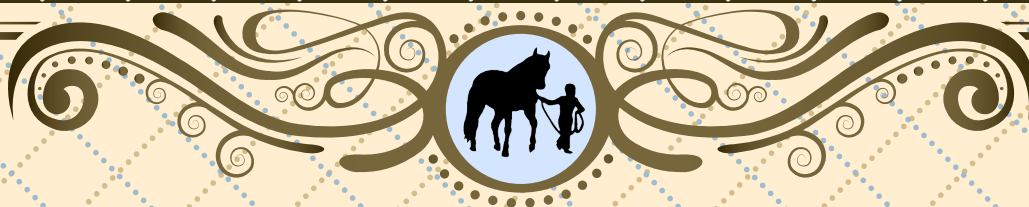

**ADDITIONAL OFFICE INFORMATION:** All participating horses must be AMHA registered. All entries must include a copy of registration papers, front and back. These will not be returned. Amateur and Youth Exhibitors must provide a copy of their current 2013 AMHA Amateur or Youth Cards. Applications for both will be available in the Show Office. Show Management reserves the right to settle and determine all questions, differences and disputes arising out of or connected with or incidental to this show within the boundaries of AMHA's current show rules. Out of state horses must have proof of a negative Coggins within 6 months and a Health

Certificate current within 45 days. A foal 6 months and younger does not require a Coggins if the Dam is negative. Owners of senior stallions three (3) and older must present a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Stallion Certificate) for cryptorchidism to Show Management prior to participating in an AMHA sanctioned show. AMHA Judge's Evaluation Cards are available in the Show Office.

**PRE-ENTRY DEADLINE: June 10, 2013**

Entries postmarked after June 10<sup>th</sup> will be charged a flat \$10 post entry fee.

All horses must be measured. Exhibitor packets and numbers will be issued after measurement. A clear copy of AMHA registration papers must be presented at time of measuring.

**HAUL IN FEE:** The Jackson County Expo Park does not charge a haul in fee.

**CLASS AWARDS:** Youth/YOTE Classes: Choice of Show Bucks or Ribbons to 6<sup>th</sup>  
Amateur/AOTE and Open Classes: Choice of Show Bucks or Ribbons to 6<sup>th</sup>  
Championship Classes: Neck sashes to Grand Champion and Reserve  
Supreme Halter Champion: Garland and Special Ribbon

**HIGH POINT AWARDS:** Calculated on one horse/one exhibitor combination

High Point Driving Horse      High Point Youth

High Point Amateur      High Point AOTE

High Point Open

**STALLS:** \$25 per day with 2 bales of shavings included on first day. Additional shavings may be purchased from the Show Office for \$9.00 per bale. Note: No more than 2 horses per stall. Stallions 2 years and older must be stabled individually. No straw is allowed at the Expo Park.

**RV SPACES:** RV spaces with no hookups are \$20.00 each day.

RV spaces with electricity and water are \$35.00 each day.

RV permits issued by the Show Office must be clearly displayed in window.

**PETS:** All dogs must be on a leash.

**CONDUCT:** Cruelty, abuse or inhumane treatment of any horse in the show ring, barn, stalls or on the show grounds is strictly prohibited. The use of stimulants or depressants or any drug that affects the showing of a horse is forbidden.

**CONCESSIONS:** Concessions will be available during the show.

**CLASS CALLS/GATE HOLDS:** Every effort will be made to maintain a working PA system. However, due to unforeseen problems with any mechanical device, the PA system and paddock calls must be considered a Show Management courtesy. It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to be sure that his/her horse is checked in with the Paddock Master and ready at the in-gate at the prescribed time. A two (2) minute gate rule will be strictly enforced.

**DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO THE JACKSON COUNTY EXPO PARK AT:**

1 Peninger Road, Central Point, Oregon 97502

From I-5 South:

Take Central Point Exit 33. Take an immediate left from the off ramp onto E. Pine St. At the second light, turn left onto Peninger Road. Continue on that road for less than one mile and enter the Jackson County Expo Park (facility will be on the right) through the Horsemen's Entrance, which is Gate 5. Follow that road to the stalls and Compton Arena (the big indoor arena).

From I-5 North:

Take Central Point Exit 33. Turn right from the off ramp onto E. Pine St. Immediately get in the left lane and take the next left at the light (about 1 block), which is Peninger Road. Continue on that road less than one mile and enter the Jackson County Expo Park (facility will be on the right) through the Horsemen's Entrance, which is Gate 5. Follow that road to the stalls and Compton Arena (the big indoor arena).

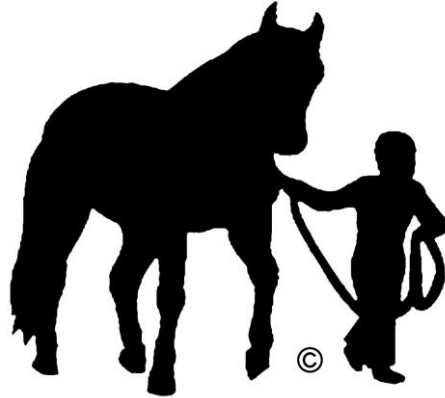

## SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Horses will be judged in accordance with the rules of the AMHA. A copy of the rule book may be found in the Show Office with the Show Manager.
2. **IT IS THE EXHIBITOR'S RESPONSIBILITY** to know the rules and regulations, as well as the requirements of each class entered.
3. This AMHA sanctioned show is open to any horse registered with the AMHA whose exhibitor is able to prove valid registration.
4. Horses must not be shod. No pads, wedges, chains or boots are allowed on the competition grounds. No whips and/or crops, lighters or any other devices detrimental to the well being of the horse shall be allowed in halter classes. For rules concerning youth exhibitors and the exhibiting of stallions, please refer to the current AMHA Rule Book.

## LEASED HORSES OR PENDING REGISTRATION PAPERS

If a horse has been leased by an Exhibitor and is to be shown in Amateur classes, it is the Exhibitor's obligation to provide written verification from the AMHA office that the lease is on file. It is also the responsibility of the Exhibitor to provide written verification from the AMHA as to a pending registration number for a horse that has not been issued papers. If, due to time constraints, the Exhibitor is unable to provide written verification for either of these cases, the Show Management will attempt to obtain verbal verification by phone from the AMHA Office during regular business hours. When the Show Management is required to make phone calls to the AMHA Office to verify eligibility, it is understood that the Exhibitor will be assessed \$10.00 per call. These charges are payable prior to receiving entry numbers. No leased horses to be shown in Amateur classes or a horse with pending registration will be shown, under any circumstances without written verification or direct verbal verification by the Show Management from the AMHA.

## GATE RULE

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitors to be aware of progress of classes and be prepared to enter the ring promptly when a class has been called without prior public notice. The gate will remain open for two (2) minutes after each class has been called to enter the ring. Horses not in the arena when the gate is closed will be eliminated from the class. Breaks have been incorporated into the show schedule for necessary tack changes. Additional gate holds, not to exceed two (2) minutes, requested by Exhibitors may be called at the discretion of the Show Manager. **ALL GATE HOLDS MUST BE REQUESTED AT THE OFFICE AT LEAST FOUR (4) CLASSES IN ADVANCE OF THE REQUESTED HOLD. THOSE GRANTED GATE HOLDS WILL BE ISSUED A GATE HOLD APPROVAL FORM THAT MUST BE PRESENTED TO THE PADDOCK MANAGER PRIOR TO THE REQUESTED HOLD.**

## ENTRY PROCEDURE

Entries must be on the official entry form for the show. Entry forms may be photocopied for use. Fill out the necessary information for each horse entered, **SIGN AND SEND COMPLETELY FILLED OUT ENTRY FORM**

Please note that **NO NUMBERS WILL BE RELEASED WITHOUT FULL PAYMENT OF ALL FEES AND A FULLY COMPLETED ENTRY. NO TELEPHONE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.** On any entry to be shown in any class, the Exhibitor must use the complete name and number of the animal **EXACTLY AS IT IS WRITTEN** on the horse's registration certificate. **A PHOTOCOPY OF BOTH SIDES OF THE REGISTRATION PAPER MUST ACCOMPANY THE ENTRY FOR EACH HORSE AND WILL NOT BE RETURNED.** Exhibitors are responsible for their own errors and those of their agents in the preparations of entry forms. All additional fees incurred during the show must be cleared in the Show Office before the conclusion of the show.

### **POST ENTRIES - ADDING CLASSES - PENALTY FEES**

Post entries or added classes will be accepted up to five classes prior to the class entering the ring provided that the horse is determined to be eligible for entry. Post entries made for the first five classes each day will be accepted up to one half (1/2) hour prior to the first class entering the ring. **POST ENTRIES MADE DURING THE SHOW MUST BE MADE AT THE SHOW OFFICE – NOT AT THE IN GATE. An entry authorization will be issued at the Show Office and must be presented to the Paddock Manager prior to entering the ring.** There will be a \$35 charge for all checks returned for lack of funds.

### **SCRATCHED CLASSES – REFUNDS**

No entry fees will be refunded without a Veterinarian's certificate as to the unsoundness of the entered horse. This must be presented to the Show Secretary before the first class on which the entry was to be shown. Failure to show a horse that has been entered constitutes a forfeiture of entry fees. In the event of the sudden illness of a horse after the entry deadline, you may substitute another animal at no additional charge. If this is done at the show, it must be done within the time frame outlined in the Post Entry section, and a Veterinarian's certificate must be provided.

### **CLASS DESCRIPTIONS AND ELIGIBILITY INFORMATION**

**The following descriptions are designed to provide a general overview of various terms and descriptions used in relation to this show. They are provided to assist newcomers and spectators gain a basic awareness of the criterion for various classes. They are IN NO WAY intended to supersede, replace or be used in lieu of the official rules of the AMHA related to showing. For more specific definitions, complete explanations and rule statements, refer to current AMHA Show Rules accessible either online at [www.amha.org](http://www.amha.org) or in the Rule Book located in the Show Office.**

**YOUTH CLASSES:** All Youth must have an AMHA Youth Card to show in Youth classes at an AMHA show. Applications are available in the Show Office or through AMHA. A child's age shall be determined by their age on January 1<sup>st</sup> and the Youth will show at that age for the calendar year. At no time shall any Youth contestant be more than 18 years old on January 1<sup>st</sup>. Children under 8 must be supervised by someone 13 or older at all times while on the event grounds. No children under 8 will be allowed in the warm-up areas without the constant supervision by someone 13 or older. There will be no playpens, strollers etc. in the warm-up areas at any time. **YOUTH TWELVE (12) YEARS AND UNDER ARE NOT ALLOWED TO SHOW A STALLION, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF WEANLING AND YEARLING COLTS.**

**YOUTH OWNED, TRAINED AND EXHIBITED (YOTE) CLASSES:** The horse exhibited by the YOTE must be trained, conditioned, groomed and shown by the YOTE or a nonprofessional family member (refer to AMHA Show Rules for definition of family member) in all divisions entered. No one with a professional trainer in the household or on the premises may compete in the YOTE Division. See the AMHA Rule Book for further details. **YOUTH TWELVE (12) YEARS AND UNDER ARE NOT ALLOWED TO SHOW A STALLION, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF WEANLING AND YEARLING COLTS.**

**AMATEUR CLASSES:** In order for an individual to enter Amateur classes, he/she must qualify for Amateur classes as defined by the current AMHA Show Rules, found in the most current Rule Book or online at [www.amha.org](http://www.amha.org) **AND HAVE A VALID AMATEUR CARD ISSUED BY AMHA.** The Amateur card number must be placed in the appropriate space on the entry form. Please include a copy of the card with entries.

Applications for Amateur cards will be available at the Show Office for Exhibitors who have not been issued a card. If the Exhibitor has not yet been issued an Amateur card and plans on showing in Amateur classes at the show, mark **PENDING** in the space requesting the number on the entry form. The Exhibitor will be asked to complete an application for Amateur status prior to being issued entry numbers at the show.

**AMATEUR CARDS ARE \$10.00 TO AMHA MEMBERS AND MUST BE RENEWED ANNUALLY. The cost to non-members of AMHA is \$50.00.** All horses shown in Amateur classes must be either owned or leased by the Exhibitors as defined in the current AMHA Show Rules. If the registration papers do not show the Exhibitor or family as the Owner of Record, a written verification of a lease from the AMHA, dated prior to the first show in which the horse is to be shown, must accompany the entries in order to allow the horse and Exhibitor to compete in any Amateur classes.

**AMATEUR OWNED, TRAINED AND EXHIBITED (AOTE) CLASSES:** The horse exhibited by the AOTE must be trained, conditioned, groomed and shown only by the AOTE or other nonprofessional family member in all divisions entered. For further clarification, go to [www.amha.org](http://www.amha.org) or check the AMHA Rule Book in the Show Office. To be eligible for this class, the horse must have been purchased or leased prior to January 1 of the current year and the transfer of ownership or lease must have been completed by AMHA by the above date.

**OPEN CLASSES:** These classes are open to all Competitors.

**SENIOR HORSES:** For the purpose of this show, senior horses are animals which are three (3) years of age or older. Senior horses compete in halter classes based on their height.

**JUNIOR HORSES:** Junior horses are animals that are no more than two (2) years of age. In halter classes, junior horses compete against each other based on their ages and heights. Classes are for weanlings, yearlings and two year olds.

**COLOR CLASSES:** Horses are judged 80% on color and 20% on conformation. Horses in color classes are circled both ways of the ring to provide the Judges an opportunity to view both sides of the animals. Multi-color classes are open to Pinto and Appaloosa marked horses. Solid color classes are open to all non-patterned colors.

**SOLID COLOR CLASSES:** Solid color classes are open to all non-patterned color of horses.

**HALTER:** Horses to be shown in hand at a walk and trot. Horses are shown with all four feet flat on the ground and square, or at least on front and one rear cannon bone perpendicular to the ground. Stretched horses are to be penalized. Transmissible weakness and unsoundness are to be penalized. In the case of two animals being judged equal, the higher placement shall be awarded to the smaller animal.

**HALTER CHAMPIONSHIPS:** Shall include the first and second place winners for the appropriate age and height divisions. The Champions will be selected from the first place winners in a given division. The second place winner from the class providing the Champion and the other first place horses will be eligible for Reserve Champion.

**SUPREME HALTER HORSE:** This individual is selected from among the Champions of the various divisions: Junior Champion Mare, Stallion and Gelding in addition to Senior Champion Mare, Stallion and Gelding.

**SHOWMANSHIP:** Classes in which the Exhibitor is judged based on the manner in which the animal is shown, groomed and fitted. The conformation traits of the horse are not a factor in these classes.

**HALTER (IN-HAND) OBSTACLE:** These are classes where the horse is shown in hand and the animal is judged 100% on the manner of the performance through the obstacle course.

**HUNTER CLASSES:** Horses are judged on their style, manners and way of going over the fences. Exhibitors are not allowed to go over the jumps, and WHIPS ARE NOT PERMITTED. Horses entered in this class must be three (3) years or older.

**JUMPER CLASSES:** Horses are judged on accumulated faults. In the event of identical scores for exhibitors, jumps are raised and a jump off is held for first place only. Exhibitors MAY go over the jumps with the horses. Horses in this class are three (3) years or older. WHIPS ARE NOT PERMITTED.

**COSTUME CLASS:** Costume classes are to be judged 75% on originality of costume and 25% on presentation. To be shown at a walk both ways of the arena.

**ROADSTER CLASSES:** Horses are shown in a bike with stirrups and no basket. Horses are to be three (3) years of age or older. The Exhibitor is dressed in racing silks. Horses are shown at three (3) speeds: the slow jog-trot, road gait and at a full extended drive on trot. Horses are not asked to rein back. Horses enter the arena clockwise at a jog-trot.

**SINGLE PLEASURE DRIVING:** Horses shown in this class are three (3) years or older. Horses are shown hitched to a show cart with metal spoke wheels. Horses are shown both ways of the arena and judged at the walk, collected trot and working trot. Horses enter the ring counter clockwise at a collected trot. Horses should stand quietly and back readily. No cross entry with Country Pleasure Driving or Classic Pleasure Driving Divisions at the same show.

**COUNTRY PLEASURE DRIVING:** Horses shown in this class are three (3) years or older. Horses are shown in a two wheeled vehicle with a basket with either wooden or metal spoke wheels. Horses are to be judged on attitude, manners, performance, quality and conformation in that order. Horses are to be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, pleasure trot, and working trot. Horses will enter the ring counter clockwise at the pleasure trot and will be required to stand quietly and back readily. No cross entry between the Single Pleasure Driving and Classic Pleasure Driving Divisions at the same show.

**CLASSIC PLEASURE DRIVING:** Horses shown in this class are three (3) years or older. Horses are shown in a two wheeled vehicle with a basket with either wooden or metal spoke wheels. Horses are to be judged on attitude, manners, performance, quality and conformation in that order. Horses are to be shown both ways of the ring at the walk, pleasure trot and working trot. Horses will enter the ring counter clockwise at the pleasure trot and will be required to stand quietly and back readily. No cross entry with Single Pleasure Driving and Country Pleasure Driving Divisions at the same show.

**REINSMANSHIP CLASSES:** Horses will be shown in a suitable two wheeled vehicle. Entries are judged primarily on the rein handling ability and skill of the driver. 75% of the score is on the handling of the reins and whip, control, posture and overall working appearance of the driver. 25% is on the condition of the harness and vehicle and neatness of attire. Control is judged by the consistency of movement at various gaits; smooth, rapid gait changes consisting of three to four steps in the called gait; accuracy of performing the requested maneuver on the rail or by the complete, symmetrical pattern requested for individual work. **WHIP MUST BE IN HAND AT ALL TIMES WHEN THE DRIVER IS IN THE RING.**

**VERSATILITY CLASS:** The horse will be shown first in driving, then shown in halter and as a hunter. Horses do not leave the arena between divisions unless a split is required for safety in the driving portion of the class. Horses must be three (3) years of age or older. NO YOUTH TWELVE (12) YEARS OF AGE AND UNDER MAY SHOW A STALLION. One Assistant or Header will be allowed in the arena only for the heading or unharnessing of the horse. The Judge will blow a whistle signaling a 2 minute time limit to remove cart and harness from horse and do any grooming or halter changes. Each horse and handler will go to the rail in order of completion. At the end of 2 minutes, the Judge will again blow the whistle. Any horse not removed from cart and harness will be disqualified. Headers will exit with the cart and harness. HORSES ARE TO REMAIN IN THE SAME ORDER FOR THE REST OF THE CLASS AS THEY GO ON THE RAIL, BOTH FOR THE HALTER AND HUNTER PORTIONS. Horses will line up head to tail for inspection to be judged at halter. Teeth will not be checked. Horses will not be asked to move. Horses will be asked to jump a course of 3 jumps.

**HEADERS IN DRIVING CLASSES:** A header is an appropriately attired (show attire or unlettered smock and suitable footwear) capable person thirteen (13) years of age or over. This attendant shall take NO action that shall affect the performance of the Miniature Horse. Only one header is allowed per horse. The header must not have a whip and shall remain at least two (2) paces distant from the head of the horse when the Judge is inspecting the horse and at all other times unless assistance in controlling the horse is needed. ADULT (19 YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER) HEADERS ARE MANDATORY FOR ALL YOUTH DRIVERS AND OPTIONAL FOR ALL OTHER DRIVERS.
